## Vanuatu faithful now finally have a chapel of their own

Two months ago, from 23rd of January to the 5th of February, three New Zealanders, three New Caledonians, six Australians, a seminarian and Fr Nely, the second assistant to bishop Fellay, accompanied Fr Bochkoltz for an action-packed mission in Vanuatu. In answer to the call of Our Lord and the pleas of the isolated village of Vunapisu — a small village of 100 on a remote island in north Vanuatu, which has remained faithful to Tradition — the group set out ready to tackle the heat, thirst and threats of missionary activity. In 10 days the little band of “missionaries” accomplished what they had set out to do, namely the difficult task of completing the village chapel in the bush! With no running water, nor electricity, their tools relied on a generator while the group relied on a lot of faith and determination! Now, the village has a large chapel dedicated to Saint Raphael. It was blessed on Sunday, 31<sup>st</sup> of January with more than 100 attending, drawn by the graces of the occasion. Fr Bochkoltz would like to thank the many faithful from New



Zealand and elsewhere who have prayed for the success of this most recent mission. He would also like to thank the generous benefactor who donated \$10'000; just enough to cover the completion of the chapel.
